Dr Molly Owens Award for Excellence in Family Medicine Training



The late Dr Molly Owens was a much-valued and esteemed college member who gave generously of her time, energy and sharp intellect in furthering the development of family medicine education and assessment both in Ireland and Malaysia. Alongside her work as a Continuous Medical Education tutor, she

served as an examiner for the MICGP examination for seventeen years, ultimately serving as Chair of the MICGP Examination Subcommittee from 2014 - 2019.

Her work contributed to the high regard in which the MICGP examination is held internationally. Dr Molly became ICGP Clinical Director of International Programmes, where she was instrumental in developing the MICGP examination in Malaysia, including the work of contextualizing the curriculum and the examination questions for the Malaysian training programme. Molly loved spending time working with her Malaysian colleagues and developed strong relationships, which ultimately strengthened the establishment of the programme. To the very end, this was the one area of her work with the College that Molly strove to continue to support.

The Dr Molly Owens Award for Excellence in Family Medicine Training is awarded to the candidate who achieves the highest overall mark in the MICGP examination and the Entrustable Professional Activities (EPAs) for the CSCST in the 12 months leading to graduation.

This is an annual award at the MInTFM Graduation Ceremony.

MInTFM Award for Excellence in Research and Audit

Research and clinical audit are integral to the practice of Family Medicine. They form the foundation of evidence-based care and ensure that our clinical decisions are informed, effective, and continuously refined. By engaging in these processes, trainees strengthen the link between clinical practice and academic inquiry, ensuring that the discipline continues to evolve in response to emerging evidence and community needs.

This award celebrates the dedication, curiosity, and professionalism of our trainees, and acknowledges their contribution to maintaining and enhancing the standards of Family Medicine.

MInTFM

Malaysia-Ireland Training in Family Medicine is a four-year pathway leading to Family Medicine Specialization. The programme had its first intake in October 2019, with the support from Ministry of Health. Trainees spend two years training in hospitals, and two years in health clinics (Klinik Kesihatan), guided during the latter by MInTFM's trained trainers.

The programme has grown exponentially since 2019 with 5 schemes across Malaysia – Northern, Central, Southern, Sabah and Sarawak, with an intake totalling 120 per year. Furthermore, the Northern and Central Schemes have been divided (administratively) into 2 regional teaching hubs respectively.

Graduates have earned Membership of the Irish College of GPs through successful examination, and have been awarded a Certificate of Satisfactory Completion of Specialist Training by MInTFM. Working Family Medicine Specialists form the Scheme Directing Teams and augment the graduates' learning throughout the 4 years. The programme constantly works towards its vision to help build a formidable workforce to deliver the best possible primary care for the people of Malaysia.
